

Chris Ye likes to stay ahead of the curve. Sometimes, he admits, a little too far ahead.

Ye's penchant for jumping on the next big thing might have its drawbacks, but it has helped shape Uken Games, the digital game-development company he co-founded with partner Mark Lampert, 30, in 2009. Uken was one of the first to offer cross-platform games, which allow users to continue playing the same game as they move from device to device. Today, Uken builds games that run on the iPhone, iPad, Android and BlackBerry platforms, as well as on Facebook, and Uken has created a number of top-ranked titles among social and mobile gamers, including Forces of War, Crime Inc. and Dark Galaxy.

"Our users love to play our games in a seamless fashion," Ye explains. "Whether they're using their phones on a train or loading up Facebook on their home computer, they have the ability to access the same player account."

For those game-changing achievements and more, Ye has been named FuEL Entrepreneur of the Year as part of the second annual <u>FuEL Awards</u>, which honour Canada's Future Entrepreneurial Leaders.

Phasing Out the Penny

In Economic Action Plan 2012, the government announced The Royal Canadian Mint will stop distributing pennies to financial institutions as of Feb. 4, 2013.

The government said in its March budget it would eliminate the penny, describing its costs of production as excessive relative to its face value and the significant handling costs imposed on retailers, financial institutions and the economy in general.

It costs 1.6 cents to produce every penny.

A 2008 report by Quebec-based bank Desjardins estimated the penny's existence cost Canada's economy about \$150 million in 2006. Canada's big banks alone handle more than nine billion pennies a year, which costs \$20 million annually to process.

Ottawa estimates the decision will save taxpayers \$11 million a year.

With the elimination of the penny, the government is recommending the value of cash transactions be rounded to the nearest five-cent increment.

Originally, the government said the mint would stop circulating the coin in the fall, but now it said that waiting until after the holiday shopping season would allow banks and businesses ample time to train staff and better inform consumers.

Credit, debit and cheque transactions will be unaffected, so one cent will still be the base unit of Canadian currency.

Over time, the penny will effectively become extinct, although the government says one -cent coins will always be accepted in cash transactions for as long as people still hold on to them.



OTTAWA, December 18, 2012 - Canada's new all-inclusive airfare advertising regulations will promote fair competition among airfare advertisers and help consumers make informed purchasing decisions, ac-

cording to the Tourism Industry Association of Canada (TIAC).

The new regulations require air service advertisers to display the total price a consumer must pay in order to fly, including all taxes, fees and charges. They also ensure that customers can access a breakdown of the

taxes, fees and charges that make up the total cost of their fare.

OVER 1,100 FUNDS AVAILABLE FOR CANADIAN NON-PROFIT SECTOR

One of the most important activities for non-profits and charities is securing funding to support their operations, however too many end up applying to the same programs year after year. New data from The Funding Portal reveals that non-profits should consider expanding their horizons as governments and private funders across Canada offer no less than 1,104 different funding sources for the sector.

Overall, Canadian non-profits and charities draw funding from four different sources: the government, donations and gifts, earned income, and transfers from businesses.

Government funding is an important source of financial support for non-profit organizations—the government accounts for as much as 45 per cent of total revenues for non-profits in Ontario, and as much as 60 per cent in Quebec, according to Imagine Canada.

In order to improve awareness and access by charities and non-profits to federal, provincial and municipal government funding programs, as well as to charitable foundations, The Funding Portal has created a searchable online database of these different sources of funding. According to the Portal's latest statistics, governments across Canada make over 1,000 funding and support programs available to non-profits, in addition to over 100 private sources of funding specifically pegged to this sector.

Some of these most recognizable sources of funding include: the Ontario Trillium Foundation, a provincial government agency with an annual budget of \$120 million; FedDev Ontario's Youth Stem program, which supports educational science outreach programs for children; and Human Resources and Skills Development Canada's Skills Link program, which provides funding for organizations that offer activities for youth facing barriers to employment.

The Portal also offers expert services to assist non-profits throughout the application process—these include a one-hour consultation to determine an applicant's optimal sources of funding, and Score It, an expert evaluation of a draft funding application prior to its submission to funders.

Launch of the 2013–14 EnAbling Change Program

The 2013–14 EnAbling Change Program will launch in January 2013. Starting January 14,

Applications will be accepted from non-profit organizations that want to be leaders in accessibility.

The EnAbling Change Program is an initiative of the Accessibility Directorate of Ontario (ADO) that provides financial support and expertise to organizations to educate an industry or sector across the province on its obligations under the Accessibility for Ontarians with Disabilities Act (AODA).

The program funds a limited number of large-scale projects that have an impact across the province. The program also funds projects that meet additional goals such as developing innovative approaches to increasing accessibility awareness and that promote Ontario as a world leader in accessibility.

Any projected funded will require an evaluation component to measure the outcomes against the objectives.





New for the 2012 tax year:

mandatory electronic filing for tax preparers

If you are an individual, a corporation, or a partnership, and you accept payment to prepare more than 10 income tax returns per year, you are considered a tax preparer and you have to file those returns electronically.

2013 indexation adjustment for personal income tax, benefit amounts, and the annual dollar limit for Tax-Free Savings Accounts (TFSAs)

Each year, certain personal income tax and benefit amounts are indexed to inflation using the Consumer Price Index data as reported by Statistics Canada.
